DESCRIPTION:

This student competition is the largest German-language competition for political education and since 1971 a "classic" in the educational landscape, which enriches the education of political topics in school. To this end, the competition offers project proposals developed by professional colleagues



on current and explosive topics for grades 4 to 12. The tasks are clearly structured, which facilitates instruction and planning, but also open enough for own design possibilities.

A wide range of topics is suitable; therefore, many school subjects are suitable for competition projects. 180 sample classes have tested and optimized the tasks, which were developed by about 40 specialists. For that reason, the Federal Centre for Civic Education is convinced that the tasks presented will work in all school forms and can be worked out with profit for all parties involved.
